Parking in Camp

Automobiles & Parking: According to national policy on transportation of Scouts, the following guidelines will be enforced at camp:

Drivers must be 18 years old or older and possess a valid license. Vehicles must be in good mechanical condition, and carry minimum liability insurance of \$50,000 - \$100,000. Neither truck beds nor trailers may carry passengers. There will be only one passenger per seat belt. Traffic regulations must be adhered to and driving should be done during daylight hours. Private vehicles are not permitted to park in campsites or on the access roads into camp.

NOTE: CAMP PARKING PERMITS FOR HANDICAPPED PARKING, SERVICE VEHICLES AND OTHER TEMPORARY SITUATIONS WILL BE ISSUED BY THE CAMP MASTER, CAMP RANGER, OR CAMP DIRECTOR.

1. If there is a trailer attached to the vehicle it can bring in and stay attached to the trailer as long as it remains out of the way for emergency traffic. **(No vehicles or trailers are allowed in campsites they must be parked parallel to road, but not blocking the entrance to the campsite.)**
2. If there is a need for accommodation due to a medical condition that person's vehicle may remain in camp.
3. Vehicles are allowed to enter camp; with a permit issued by the Campmaster, Camp Ranger, or Camp Director for the purpose of dropping off gear, then the vehicle is returned to the parking lot as soon as possible. **(No trailers are allowed in campsites they must be parked parallel to road, but not blocking the entrance to the campsite.)**
4. There will be no driving around the camp other than to go to an assigned campsite.
5. Events may designate some vehicles for entrance into the camp and be used to transport food and materials needed for that event. However, this should not mean transporting people around the camp unless a medical condition dictates the necessity for such action.
6. Whenever possible vehicles taken inside of the camps should remain in the designated parking areas within the camp.
7. If the campsite assigned to the unit is not readily accessible to the main parking area, a vehicle may remain at the campsite area for emergency use and transport. However it should remain out of the camping area.
8. During Summer Camp Council Personnel should be allowed to drive into the camps for meetings and remain in designated parking areas. However, they must comply with posted speed limits and be aware of youth present.
